


### The Start of a New Era

This Fall brings a new beginning to Scouting for Cub Scout Pack 127. Young ladies will now be allowed to join Cub Scouts. The Boy Scouts' program is becoming Scouts BSA in February 2019 to reflect the decision to include young women. The overall organization's name will remain the same (Boy Scouts of America (BSA)); only the program for older youth will change its name. Other Boy Scouts programs for older youth — such as an outdoor adventure program called Venturing — were already open to girls. But those programs didn't offer girls the chance to attain the highest rank of Eagle Scout.

We have had interest from several families who have sisters of present Cub Scouts or Boy Scouts who want to participate in one or both programs. There is also interest from new families in the area who have daughters who have expressed interest in joining. There is no limitation as to how far the young women can go, up to and now including Eagle Scout. The Pack and the Troop are preparing for these changes and the need for female scouters. The Pack has several female leaders now but the way the new program is organized, the dens must remain same sex. In the past, dens have been grouped by the same age and rank. Now they can have up to 3 age groups and 3 ranks all in the same den to build some critical mass as the program gets off the ground. One steadfast rule remains and that is two deep leadership but for a female den, at least one den leader must be female and over the age of 21. Pack meet-

ings may be coed with all Cub Scouts coming together to celebrate their achievements.

As we move forward with these changes, Scouting will truly become a family affair that is all inclusive. We have a recruiting night on September 13<sup>th</sup> at the schools throughout the area including D47 and St. Thomas. We will have to see what comes of our efforts and watch the Pack and Troop grow. It is interesting times we live in as we take our tried and true program to all youth in America to build a better Nation under God. If they all live by the Scout Oath and Law, America will be in good hands. Thank you for your continued support for Cub Scout Pack 127 and Boy Scout Troop 127 (soon to be Scouts BSA Troop 127).





### Prayer for the Canonization of Fr. Michael J McGivney


