





Crystal Lake Food Pantry



No one should go hungry.

The Council is obligated to work the food pantry the first Saturday of every month and also the third Thursday evening. The emails had gone out earlier in the week for help at the food pantry the week before. As usual I asked for at least 15 council members to show up and cover the 3.5-hour shift.

We usually get so outside of the council resources to help and with the 15 members the minimum coverage would be filled. The first Saturday January 4th 2020 we had a total of 7 members show up to help. I'm sure with the time split between the blood drive and the food pantry our council members time commitment was worn thin. The members who help that day served 57 clients along with the few outside volunteers for an average of 6 clients served per volunteer. That makes for a busy day. Saturday is also the day that food drop from Sam's club along with a few others

stores occurs. We had 6 pallets of food from Sam's club alone. We sorted what we could of the food until opening time then all of our attention was focused on the clients. We had finished up with the last client about 12:30 or a half hour after closing. A few of the 7 members stayed to help close up afterwards which includes making sure the produce that is displayed for the clients is refrigerated at the end of day. I stayed until 1:00 pm making sure the food that wasn't processed was placed in the cooler or freezer and cleaned up the back room a bit. The food that was left un-processed and not given away that day was mostly disposed of on Monday by other volunteers.

Our next obligated Saturday Food Pantry volunteer day will be February 1st. I'm still looking for a minimum of 15 to help that day. Come join us between 8:30 and noon.



Last month I mentioned the new Exemplification of Charity, Unity, what charities we support. and Fraternity. This month, I'd like to share it with you directly.


