Grand Knight's Report

Dear Brothers,
Our new fraternal year has begun. It has been another busy and productive month. We started the month out with our July Business meeting. Prior to the start of the meeting we had two donation presentations. These were donations that were part of the charitable disbursements from the previous fraternal year (2017-2018). PGK Mike Bradley was on hand to make the presentations. The first went to



CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates) for \$500. CASA as you may recall works with neglected and abused children that are put under temporary foster care because their parents cannot or will not take care of them. They give children a voice in court, so they can grow up in safe, permanent homes where they can thrive. The second presentation was made to the Illinois Fire Safety Alliance (IFSA) for \$500. The IFSA is dedicated to fire safety, burn prevention and supporting burn survivors. The 28th Annual camp "I am me" is a week-long camp held this year on July 17-23 at YMCA Camp Duncan in Ingleside, IL. The camp provides the setting for child burn survivors to share their common experiences while being able to play and not feel self-conscious about their scars. The council also was given an Eagle Scout Project presentation by Hunter Berkland of Troop 127. Hunter is building two picnic benches, and a toybox at a preschool playground. He made a request for \$200 towards his project. The council later voted and passed a motion to approve the \$200 toward the project. On Tuesday, July 17th before our monthly social meeting we will be hosting a rosary held at the rosary walk at the Oak Street church. This will be followed by snacks and refreshments to all that attend.

We will be adding 2 new events this year. On Friday, July 27th and Friday, August 31st we will have our Brat-

Mobile selling food at the Crystal Lake Brewery. We will need help cooking and serving food at both events. Food will be served from 5pm to 8:30pm outside the brewery. If you cannot help, then come out and have some dinner and a cold one. Look out for more details on the August 31st event as this will be tied in with a fundraiser for the Knights of Columbus Coats for Kids program.



It is that time of year that the Troop goes to summer camp. This year we went to Canyon Camp in Stockton, Illinois. Just a couple of hours west of here along the idyllic Coon Creek. We had 14 of our 18 scouts attend camp including our 4 new scouts. Yours truly also went this year after missing last year.



The scouts had signed up for 60 merit badges (MB) at Canyon Camp ranging from Astronomy to Weather. PGK Marty Zopp is the Troop Merit Badge Counselor and did a terrific job of checking in with the scouts and the MB coordinators so that our guys stayed on track throughout the week. I help the new scouts make their way through the Canyon Rangers program (knocks out a bunch of Second and First Class requirements) as well as the Swimming MB and Basketry MB. All in all, we came home with 56 completed MB's with 4 partials to work on. They did a terrific job.

Friday night immediately after dinner had been finished being served outside, the bell and siren went off to take shelter in the Mess Hall. We were finally given the all clear to return to our campsite at 10:30 PM to assess the damage and what had gotten wet. We luckily were not in too bad of shape and went down for the night only to have the heavy rain continue for most of it, so we got to pack up wet on Saturday morning. The big news out of the Pantry is that this summer they are celebrating their 35th Anniversary! The Board of Directors (made up of the liaison members of all the community churches participating in the Pantry) have been discussing how to celebrate this event. Parishioner Marilyn Georgy, Past President and wife of Brother Paul, and our own Brother Bill Genzler, are heading the committee. Our Council was contacted and asked if the Knights would be interested in bringing the BratMobile and cooking all of the 'donated' food that the pantry will supply. And if we are, could we possibly suggest the dates (Saturdays) that would work for us. This was discussed with (then) GK Mike Bradley and (now) GK Mike Kebr and we agreed this would be a good promotional event for the Council. It was discussed as an agenda item at the July Business meeting. At this time, we have tentatively scheduled Sat-

urday, September 15th. We are still waiting on the Pantry to determine that they have enough volunteer workers. We will know by their next board meeting, on August 13th. Try to keep that Saturday open if you will be able to work when we call!

The first Saturday of July was a little light, with 36 clients representing 113 persons as we distributed 3,675 pounds of food. We had a nice showing of workers again, so the load was not too bad. Please considering helping on the first Saturday of the month and/or the third Thursday of the month. This can be for an hour or the entire shift.

Who has the Golden Ticket



When the education journey ends and a seminarian is ordained, State Council sends him an ordination card with a check in the amount of \$100 and a beautiful copy of the "Daily Missal".

Booklets are out, and more are being distribute. Please do your part by asking your Brother Knight to buy one or more of his raffle tickets or better yet, get a booklet from yours truly and tell others with the booklet in hand, the purpose of the Vocational Drive of the Knights of Columbus. Whether you win or not,

there is a future priest, nun and brother who will.


Pro-Life Report





Prayer for the Canonization of Fr. Michael J McGivney


