As I stated in a very brief update last month, our Scouting for Food effort this year was a rousing success. The Pack distributed almost a thousand bags with flyers the weekend of February 28th to homes around St. Thomas-Oak Street. The Troop then collected the bags that were left on the door steps the following weekend. Thankful the weather cooperated and except for being a little chilly, we succeed in our endeavor.

Upon collecting and sorting the food and other household goods in preparation for delivery to the Crystal Lake Food Pantry, we counted and weighed it all at their request. We had 3,005 items weighing in at 2,486 pounds and collected \$220 in cash donations. We then helped put it away once delivered to the Pantry.

The Pack had a great Pack meeting in April with a demonstration of Birds of Prey by the Flint Creek Wildlife Rehab Center (<http://www.flintcreekwildlife.org/>) located in Barrington. They brought a hawk, screech owl and turkey vulture for the scouts to see (and if I wasn't such a bad photographer, there would be pictures). The Center takes in injured birds and mammals and rehabilitates them for release back into the wild. If they cannot be rehabbed, they become residents at their Barrington or Northerly Island locations. It is an all volunteer group so if you are so inclined, check out their website and support them if you wish.

The Pack also had rank advancements for Tigers and Bears moving them into Wolf and Webelos I respectively. June will bring rank advancements for Wolves and Webelos I at the Family Campout and Pack meeting. In between all of this will be a campout at Stronghold Camp in Oregon, Illinois (<http://www.strongholdcenter.org/index.html>) the first weekend in May.

The Troop is headed to the Lincoln Pilgrimage in Springfield the last weekend in April, commemorating the 150th Anniversary of President Lincoln's Assassination, Death & Burial. Our Philmont crew will be taking the Lincoln Trail Hike which is a 20 mile trek in the footsteps of Abraham Lincoln. It was one of the first BSA hiking trails established back in 1926. Our own Robert Kosin made the trek (9-28-68) and would be happy to regale you with his adventures and accomplishment which next to getting his Eagle Award was his second best experience in Scouting.

As you can see, busy young men all around and all due to the generous support of Father McCormick Council 3880. Thank you for building our future leaders of tomorrow.

Every month the Parish has a Food Pantry donation day, generally on the first Sunday. In volunteering at our own Crystal Lake Food Pantry, there are a few things I have observed. There are a lot of really needy people in our Community, just like all of the Communities. My sister-in-law runs the one in Johnsbury, and we compare notes once in a while. It is amazing the amount of food that is available, but it is also just as amazing as how much more is needed! One of the 'jobs' I have had over the years is stocking the shelves. And there are items we just don't have much of that are really staples in the everyday kitchen.

We have some fantastic management at the CLFP. In a conversation with one of the people a year or so ago, we learned that with some savvy purchasing techniques he was able to get a lot more of a product than before. New programs open up, just as new people can bring fresh ideas. Another thing we found out was what they CAN and CANNOT get through these programs like the state one. They had put up a sign showing this, we looked at it and said, wow, nice! But then, I for one, never did anything with that knowledge. So here it is, a list of the items that they only have if someone donates them! So, next time you want to drop off some food for the Food Pantry at church here is what they need!

Let's see if we can't make an even bigger impact on those we are helping by giving them what they need... along with our prayers of course!


