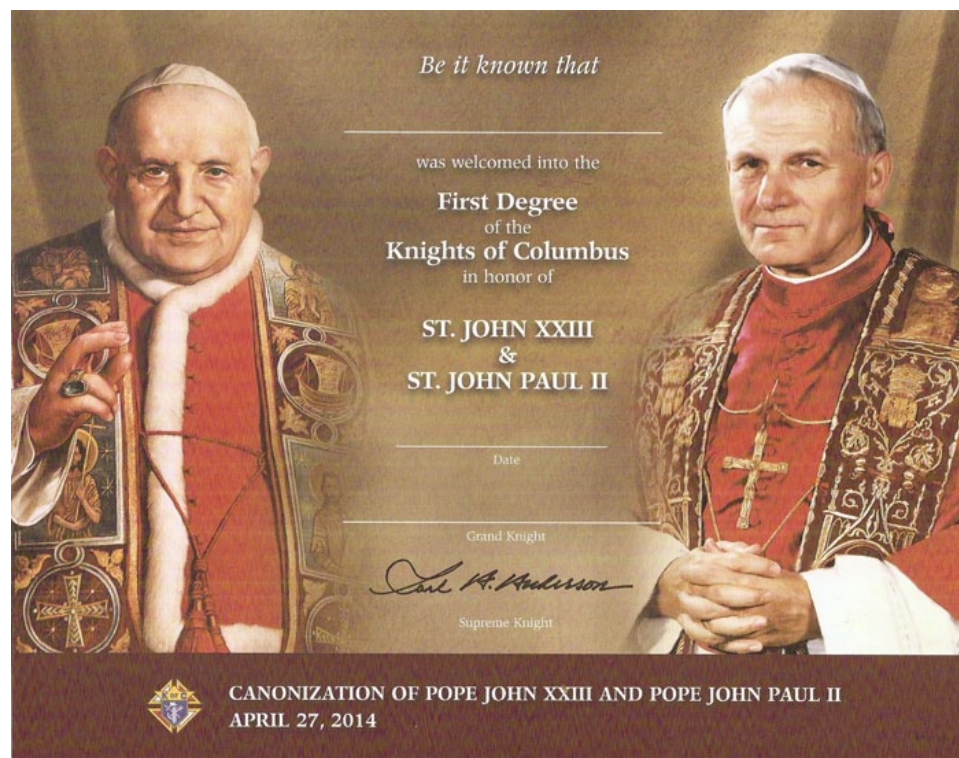

Happy Easter to all of you and your families.

**That Man is You:** You may be aware of the Council's heavy involvement with the That Man is You (TMIY) program – a men's-only faith program that will start the Saturday after Labor Day. It will be held each Saturday morning, bright and early, running for 13 weeks in the Fall and 13 weeks after the New Year.

I'm excited about this program on a number of fronts. First, we are doing something that is evangelical for our Parishioners. We have that reputation out there as a great group of guys who cook, help out and do some very good service work. Yes, that's key to being a member of our Order, but there is more.

We are a Catholic Fraternal Society – the largest such in the world. We are dedicated to supporting the Church, both in prayer and evangelization – a call from St. John Paul II in his New Evangelization. To that end, we are becoming involved with programs and events that move us in the direction Msgr. Hermes has been taking our parish for years. We started by sponsoring St. Thomas' participation in the Great Lakes Catholic Men's Conference. We're taking a great leap forward with TMIY.

TMIY has been phenomenally successful where ever it has been held. It is currently in 400 parishes around the country. Closer to home, Brother Jerry Smith from Council 776 has organized a very successful TMIY program at St. Mary's in Woodstock. Sixty men arrive each Saturday for breakfast, video and small group sessions beginning at 6 a.m. and wrapping up by 7:30 a.m.

I figured that it was Jerry's hearty breakfast that brought in so many men. He's telling me it's the message – a message each of us as men need to hear. We have a great steering committee formed right now and we're just getting in the process of organizing the sessions. I have a strong promotional background so you will hear a lot about TMIY beginning in July.

This is a program open to all men of the parish. Please consider attending and bringing another parishioner along with you. Find out what brings men back time after time. ### **The Eagle Scout a/k/a It's Only A Pin by S. Kurtz Hingley, 1930.**

A fond Mother watches her boy where he stands, apart from his comrades tonight,  
And see placed on his camp-battered tunic, a badge...An Eagle... the emblem of right.  
It seems to her just a few short months have passed since he joined with the youngsters next door.  
How proud he was then of his Tenderfoot pin as they told of the message it bore.

But the years have gone as he struggled along to learn what the Scout Law's about;  
He practiced them daily, that Oath and that Law, until now - he is an Eagle Scout.  
You may smile with your worldly wise wisdom at this and say, "Why it's only a pin."  
But I tell you no honors he'll gain as a man Will mean quite as much to him.

The red, white and blue of the ribbon you see are symbols of honor and truth.  
He has learned how to value these fine attributes In the glorious days of youth.  
And the out-flinging wings of the Eagle that rests on the breast of this knight of today  
Are the things which shall lift him above petty deeds, and guide him along the right way.

Yes, it's only a pin, just an Eagle Scout badge, but the heart that's beneath it is true,  
And will throb to the last for the things that are good; a lesson for me... and for you.

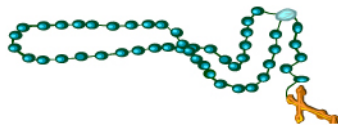
