February Council Awards:



This January, following FOCUS' Student Leadership Summit, a group of 40 missionaries who are directing various mission trips all over the world this year, traveled to Mexico City, Mexico for five days of training. Our time in Mexico was filled with practical training for our missions, as well as prayer, and exploring! We were blessed to visit the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe and the spot where she appeared to St. Juan Diego in 1531! We spent time in prayer in front of the miraculous tilma with Our Lady's image on it which is still intact almost 500 years later! It was such a peaceful place to visit, knowing that Our Blessed Mother had come to that very spot, and called her children to follow her Son. The thought that stayed in my mind during our visit was a story that Archbishop Aquila of Denver, shared with all those present at the Student Leadership Summit, which was an experience in prayer he had during a visit to the tilma last November. He was praying before Our Lady, and praising how miraculous it was that she appeared and that her presence is still on this tilma. Her response to his prayer was that, what is even more miraculous is her Son, Jesus being made present, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity in the Eucharist! How blessed are we that we are able to receive Our Lord so often in the Eucharist, and then are able to share Him with those we encounter each day!

I will be leading a mission to Honduras, this month, from March 22-29. We will work with a mission group called the Missioners of Christ; who serve the rural communities of the Honduran mountains, bringing catechesis and the sacraments. I will also be directing a mission to Denver this May to work with Christ in the City and the Community of the Beatitudes to serve the poor and homeless in Denver, CO. I am so excited and thankful that Jesus has asked me to go serve His people around the world! Pope Francis says about mission: "In fidelity to the example of the Master, it is vitally important for the Church today to go forth and preach the Gospel to all: to all places, on all occasions, without hesitations, reluctance, or fear. The joy of the Gospel is for all people: no one can be excluded" (Evangelii Gaudium 23).

Thank you for your continued support this year! Without the Knight's generosity, I would not be able to follow where Jesus has been calling me! Please pray for me as I continue to serve on campus, as well as abroad! Know of my prayers for all of you!

Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act

The U.S. Senate is working to pass legislation to stop “Pain Capable Unborn Child” Abortions. It is now recognized that an unborn child at 20 weeks old can sense pain and therefore, should be protected from abortion. This bill is similar to a House of Representatives bill that passed in June of last year.

This is an incredibly important piece of legislation that we can help to get passed. All we need to do is contact our Senators and let them know we want them to support this bill. The Bill is called, Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act, S. 1670.

It will take you to the National Right to life site where you can enter your information and tell your Senators that you whole-heartedly support this bill.

Hobby Lobby - HHS Mandate

During the week of March 24, the U.S. Supreme Court will hear arguments against the Affordable Care Act’s mandate of employers providing drugs coverage for drugs that are against their religious beliefs. Hobby Lobby has been at the core of this debate, but other companies and religious organizations have gotten on board as well. This is the first very strong challenge to the Affordable Care Act and the Obama Administration has to put up a strong fight in order to prevent weakening the health care program it designed. On the Right to Life side, this mandate forces employers to provide post-conception medicine to terminate a possible pregnancy - sometimes called “morning after pills” as well as other medications that can terminate a pregnancy.

This is another important battle in the government intrusion on our religious beliefs. Stay tuned.


