Monthly Breakfast: June 14, 2015, early this month due to Fathers Day is the third Sunday of the month.

The Troop has a crew of twelve (8 Scouts and 4 Scouters) going to Philmont Scout Ranch departing on June 12th. They will be trekking through the mountains and valleys of New Mexico for a week possibly reaching altitudes of over 12,000 feet above sea level. They will carry everything they need on their backs and will trek anywhere from 75 to 120 miles during the week depending on the trek they are assigned.

Philmont, the Boy Scouts of America's High Adventure base, challenges Scouts and Venturers with more than 214 square miles of rugged northern New Mexico wilderness. Backpacking treks, horseback cavalcades, and training and service programs offer young people many ways to experience



this legendary country. Two landmarks of the Ranch are Baldy Mountain (elev. 12,445 ft.) and the Tooth of Time (elev. 9,003 ft. and shown below) which are incorporated in some of the treks crews take.

The Scout Ranch originated in 1938 through a land donation by Waite Phillips, an Oklahoma oilman and rancher. He offered 35,857 acres of his ranch to the Boy Scouts of America in 1938 to serve as a national wilderness camping area. The area was named Philturn Rockymountain Scoutcamp (after Phillips' name and the Scout slogan "Do a Good Turn Daily"). Fees for the first summer were set at \$1 per week per camper, and 189 Scouts from Texas, Kansas, Louisiana, and Oklahoma arrived for the first experience at a national backcountry Scout camp. Through additional donations from Mr. Phillips and others, the ranch grew to its present size of 214 square miles (136,960 acres). The name was change to Philmont Scout Ranch in 1941. The Ranch now hosts 22,000 scouts a year based on all activities.

Our crew will travel by train to get to the Ranch. They will have a day at base camp and then will be off on their trek. They will have a Ranch guide for the first two days and then will be on their own to find their way along the hills, valleys and mountains of the Ranch. They will need to find water, suitable camping sites, and prepare freeze dried meals (using the two stoves that were donated) all while trying to stay hydrated and adjust to the altitude. The air gets a little thin up there. They will return home on Sunday June 21st and will most likely really enjoy their first night back in their own bed. They will have tales to tell and hopefully some great photos to share.

The Pack, while not going on a high adventure trip, does have a family campout scheduled in June as well as several day camps for the different ranks of Cub Scouts in July. They will also be marching in the Memorial Day Parade in Crystal Lake. They have hikes, a fishing derby and other activities planned throughout the summer.

All of this is made possible by the continued support of Father McCormick Council #3880. We appreciate all that you do for us in sponsoring the Pack and the Troop to allow these young men to build character and memories that will last them a lifetime. We wish you all well and for those families that paid the ultimate sacrifice and lost a loved one in the service to our country, we offer our thanks and our prayers for those who gave all.
