

No one should go hungry.

Thursday, May 18<sup>th</sup>, was the Council's monthly third-Thursday of the month at the Pantry. Since that is 'technically' tomorrow night, I hope it went well! We seem to have a week with many people showing up, and sometimes only a few... the typical story of or busy lives! But we always are able to take care of Business there. We found out last month that they had changed the hours from 5 to 8 PM to 5 to 7PM, in response to the actual times the clients have been there. There are always exceptions, and of course we take care of them as needed. We have been having a normal inflow of clients the past several months, of around a dozen families.

As part of this service, we have been asked to sign a form the pantry has provided to us which basically says we respect the rights and privacy of the clients. I had blank forms at the May Business meeting, and quite a few have signed them, along with those signed at the pantry days. We have more for anyone who is a 'newbie' and shows up. For some time now we have also been working the Food Pantry on the 1<sup>st</sup> Saturday of every other month... so our next Saturday will be coming up in a couple of weeks, on June 3<sup>rd</sup>. Hope that we get a good showing of workers for that one. We generally have one wife there for every 1 ½ to 2 Brothers, which is great. We all know where we would *really* be without our spouses! I also just got a request from the Food Pantry so see if we would be interested in working the 1<sup>st</sup> Saturday of EVERY month. We had started

that way several years ago but then the parish Youth Group said they wanted to help so we split the months. But then they were not able to get enough help, so the Light of the World team took over. They are bow in the same boat. We seem to be the one group that can always fulfill the needs and have the manpower (people power?) there to make it work. We need to bring this up before the Council at the upcoming June Business Meeting to find if we have enough interest to do this every month. Thoughts and comments will be greatly appreciated concerning this. Let us know!

# Association of Horizon's Summer Camp

Working and vacation don't sound like they belong together. Every year, I find a bit of heaven one week a year. It's filled with work, fun activities, compassion and a sense of humor.

25 years ago, a group of people decided to take over a summer camp program for disabled adults that a large national organization abandoned, forming their own "mom and pop" 501-c Charity. This time of the year, you will see plenty of media stories about special summer camps. Most of them center on children. Few summer camps are held for special adults and Association of Horizon is unique in putting together an experience unmatched by anything I've seen anywhere else.

Last year's Association of Horizon's summer camp featured 111 adult campers with physical disabilities. Each one is paired up with an able-

bodied volunteer personal attendant. The Camp experience is free to camper and volunteer.

\Horizon's Mission statement is to organize individuals with and without disabilities to challenge themselves, develop responsibility and grow through interacting and working together. The vision is to break down the barriers between able-bodied and disabled. Limitations are to be overcome, new abilities are discovered and an increased awareness of self and others.

For the Campers, it's a vacation they look forward to every year. For their families, some needed respite from the daily care of a loved one. For many first time volunteers, it's an introduction to a community and individuals they've never seen this up close and personal.

A large number of the volunteers we depend on are 16-21 year old. The challenge for many is to quickly learn what personal care for another individual entails - through communication and empathy. I am heartened to see so many caring young people. They learn the value of every individual, regardless of physical abilities, and take that experience into the world.

We are in need of male volunteers. If you know a young adult or a retired adult, with that week available, we do a good job of matching people by their abilities. I tell all the first time volunteers that if they never return, they'll never forget the experience.



## Prayer for the Canonization of Fr. Michael J. McGivney

God, our Father, protector of the poor and defender of the widow and orphan, you called your priest, Fr. Michael J. McGivney, to be an apostle of Christian family life and lead the young to the generous service of their neighbor.
