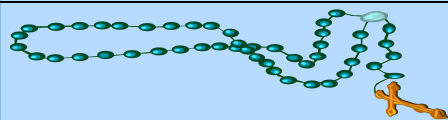

No one should go hungry.

May the 4th be with you (this is the only time I'll use a Star Wars reference). OK so that was the Saturday at the food pantry. The day started out well with the new longer hours from 8:30 am the 2 pm. Council members showed in strength early that day starting at 8:30. Along with volunteers who work the pantry on a regular basis, others that were suggested strongly they need to do some community service, the early hours were filled and the food coming in the doors was processed before the opening at 10am. The rush was on as the doors opened at 10 am. The volunteer force quickly ran through almost 30 clients by 11:30. The number of volunteers outnumbered the carts used for clients. By noon most of the volunteers had to leave (since it is a busy Saturday in May) the numbers left to work the afternoon shift was exactly 4. I give a special thank you to John Walsh, PGK, FS, SK and all around nice guy Steve Haugh for sticking around along with my wife Kathy. With me working the scale, receiving door and helping where I could with clients we served another 12. The crew finally finished up between 2:15 and 2:30. I finally left the pantry about 2:45 after some clean-up and securing of the premises.

On Thursday May 16th the council worked the pantry from 5pm to 7pm again council volunteers made a strong showing. The volunteers outnumbered the carts again. With the strong showing of volunteers the council served 26 clients. We all walked out at 7pm with some of the volunteers leaving early as the number of clients dwindled by the end of the evening.

I'm still looking for a council member or two to help with being a team leader of this event.

The June pantry volunteer days for the council will be Saturday the 1st (8:30am to 2pm) and Thursday the 20th (5pm to 7pm).

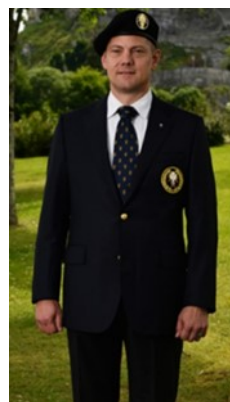

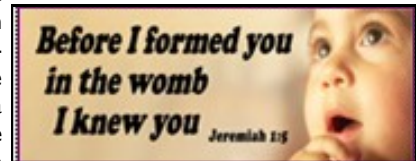
Dear Brothers

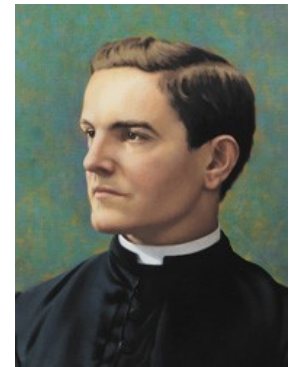
