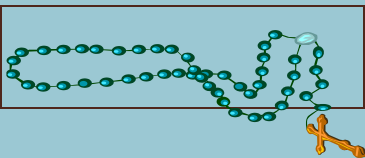

Chaplains Message

From time to time, people have asked me about proper Mass Etiquette, things to DO and NOT DO in Mass. So, I am devoting this column to a list that I hope you find



1. **Fast before Mass.** It is Church law that one fasts for at least 1 hour before receiving Holy Communion. Water and medicine can be consumed, of course. [The purpose is to help us prepare](#) to receive Jesus in the Eucharist.

2. **No Food and Drink in Church.** The exceptions would be a drink for small children, water for the priest or choir (if discreet) and water for those who are ill. Bringing a snack into church is not appropriate or respectful (this includes chewing gum). The Church is a place for prayer.

3. **Cross yourself with Holy Water on entering and leaving church.** This is a reminder of our Baptism, which made us members of Christ's Church. Do this mindfully and prayerfully.

4. **When we enter and leave Church, genuflect toward the Tabernacle.** Christ is present for our sake. By allowing our right knee to hit the floor, we acknowledge He is our Lord and God. If someone is physically unable to genuflect, then a reverent bow is sufficient.

5. **Dress modestly and appropriately.** Wear your Sunday Best. Men take your hats off. As Catholics we believe that God comes down to meet us at every Mass. So, why would we not dress up? I realize many dress codes today have been relaxed, but just think of where you are!

6. **Show up at least a few minutes early.** This will allow you to pray and better prepare yourself for Mass. If you are running late, then try to enter Church without much of a distraction.

7. **Cell phones should never be used in Mass for calls or texting.** Emergencies are obvious exceptions, and in this case, please excuse yourself and walk out into the narthex. Some people may have the readings or prayers on their

phones, which is appropriate, but still be discreet.

8. **Please be quiet while in Church.** Once you enter the sanctuary, it is not the time or place to visit with those around you. If you must talk do so as quietly and briefly as possible. Please be mindful of those around you who would like to pray, which is more appropriate for this space.

Please welcome the presence of families with children at Mass, as Jesus would. Parents may sit by Cry Room or Narthex, when you feel these will be needed.

9. **Prepare your offering before Mass.** Christ tells us not to let your left hand know what your right hand is doing when you make your offering. This happens more easily when you are prepared ahead of time. We try to announce 2nd collections in advance when they do occur.

10. **No bulletin reading during Mass.** Imagine you invited a guest to your house and before dinner (or during) they decided to read a magazine instead of talking to you. That is what is happening in God's house when you read the bulletin during Mass.

11. **Bow before receiving Holy Communion.** Since we are receiving the Body of Christ, show your respect with a bow of the head, before you receive. This is an ancient practice that has continued until this day.

12. **Do not leave early.** We should stay to the end of the recession and the hymn that accompanies it. While there may be exceptions, most who leave early don't really need to.

13. **Leave quietly.** We encourage you to visit with others, but once you are outside of the main sanctuary of the Church, so you won't disturb others who want to stay and pray.

May this Lent be a time of deepened spiritual renewal and revival in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, for all of you.

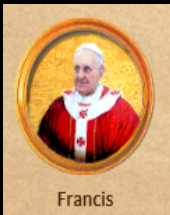
